

Working in the strawberry packing house


Working in the strawberry packing house

- In the packing house at fruit farms like Langdon Manor, strawberries must be packed up into punnets in order to go out to the supermarket
- They must be a consistent colour
- The strawberries should all be a consistent size
- It will be your job to assemble a punnet of strawberries that are the correct colour and consistent size, to go out to the supermarket





Strawberry colour chart




Cut out the individual strawberries from the sheet. Sort your strawberries into those that are the right colour, using the colour chart above. Then select those of similar size to stick onto your punnet to go to the supermarket.
